

General Operating: Federal Grant Programs (Recurring annual grant programs)

HMEP Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness

U.S. Dept of Transportation funds to increase State, Territorial, Tribal and local effectiveness in safely and efficiently handling hazardous materials accidents and incidents, enhance implementation of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act of 1986, and encourage a comprehensive approach to emergency training and planning by incorporating the unique challenges of responses to transportation situations, through planning and training. Requires a 20% local match

NOAA National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration

U.S. Dept of Commerce provides funds to the State of Alaska due to Alaska's high threat for tsunamis. The allocation supports the promotion of local, regional, and state level tsunami mitigation and preparedness; installation of warning communications systems; installation of warning communications systems; installation of tsunami signage; promotion of the Tsunami Ready Program in Alaska; development of inundation models; and delivery of inundation maps and decision-support tools to communities in Alaska.

RCASP Remote Community Alert Systems

U.S. Dept of Commerce funds to provide for outdoor alerting technologies in remote communities effectively underserved by commercial mobile service for the purpose of enabling residents of those communities to receive emergency messages. This program is a contributing element of the Warning, Alert, and Response Network (WARN) Act.

HMGP Hazardous Mitigation Grant Program

FEMA funds to State and local governments to implement long-term hazard mitigation measures after a major disaster declaration. The purpose of the HMGP is to reduce the loss of life and property due to natural disasters and to enable mitigation measures to be implemented during the immediate recovery from a disaster. The HMGP is authorized under Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act.

PDM Pre-Disaster Mitigation

FEMA funds to support planning and implementation of cost-effective mitigation projects primarily addressing natural hazards focused on reducing overall risks to populations and structures, while reducing reliance on funding from disaster declarations. A FEMA-approved Standard or Enhanced Mitigation Plan is required to be eligible for project funding. Requires a 25% local match, 10% for small impoverished communities.

EHRSA Earthquake Hazards Reduction State Assistance

This program is non-competitive to states in support of the Central U.S. Earthquake Consortium (CUSEC), Northeast States Emergency Consortium (NESEC), Western States Seismic Policy Council (WSSPC), and the Cascadia Region Earthquake Workshop (CREW) in delivering education and training to communities for development of seismic policies, sharing information, and promoting programs to reduce earthquake-related losses.
